## Naming Opportunity Descriptions

### *Community Building* (\$300,000)

The Community Building is 1,700 sq. ft. and will house a multi-purpose commons area, reception and administrative office, storage space, and a community kitchen. Most of this space (1,100 sq. ft.) is allocated for the commons area that will serve a variety of needs for the school including a lunch room, performance and music education space, as well as parent and community education space. This space will also be utilized during school and community events. The reception area (182 sq. ft.) and administrative office (90 sq. ft.) are modest in size and the overall design places emphasis on the students' experience and the importance of community space for the school. The Community Building will also be available for use by other non-profit organizations looking to gather during non-school hours.

### *Children's House Building* Named in honor of Dorothy King (FUNDED)

The Children's House Building became a Montessori school in 1972. Due to the new addition of two preschool classrooms, the Children's House will get an update and change configurations slightly. Infant-parent and Toddler programs will move into an existing preschool classroom (Cedar), which is much larger than the current toddler space. This move will allow the Toddler program to bring in materials and activities not currently possible in the smaller space. The previous toddler classroom will become a staff workroom, currently non-existent on either campus. The planned 500 sq. ft. staff workroom will offer the teaching staff opportunities to engage and collaborate with one another. This will improve instructional practice and support staff retention and advancement. The rearrangement of classrooms will provide a larger space for the current parent resource library and gathering space where parents can access family education resources. This vibrant and welcoming space will also foster increased community building and peer support for parents.

### *New Preschool Building* Named in honor of Patty Christensen (FUNDED)

The new preschool addition will create two 1,000 sq. ft. preschool classrooms, providing a space for Cedar and the opportunity for an additional classroom, Spruce. The Spruce classroom increases our ability to offer morning programs for those families who desire it. The additional classrooms will allow for the school to offer a true Montessori extended day model, allowing more students to experience a full-day program and opportunities to engage with in-depth studies. A longer school day will in turn ease the students' transitions from Kindergarten to Elementary.

### *Elementary Building* Named in honor of Voyager Montessori (FUNDED)

The New 2,000+ square foot Voyager Elementary Building will house our 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders. The addition of this building allows our campuses to be united on one campus, a long-time dream of our school community. The unified campus will allow for more collaboration between staff, students, and families. Our elementary students will be able to mentor primary students more regularly, so our reading buddies and other collaborative programs will expand. The Elementary Building will have a covered outdoor patio off the building to serve as an outdoor learning space and classroom.

### *Arts Building* Named in honor of Sheryl Yahner (FUNDED)

The Art Building will expand the art program and create space for creativity in art in a cross-curricular, multi-age program. Currently, the Art Specialist teaches only at the Elementary campus due to space limitations. With the new 600 sq. ft. art building, the Art Specialist can expand the curriculum to include Kindergarten. The building will also be a space for students to use during regular class time as they create art projects related to their core subjects (e.g. diorama for a book report, timeline for history, map painting for geography, scientific models, etc.) without using resources and space in their classrooms. A wall of windows will allow for natural light to inspire our artists.

### *Preprimary Classroom Huckleberry* (\$50,000)

The Huckleberry Classroom is where our weekly parent-infant class meets and creates a community built on education and support. Parents and their infants learn about nutrition, development, sleep, positive guidance, and a supportive home environment. The Huckleberry Classroom also contains our Toddler program for children ages 18 months to 3 years. The toddlers experience a safe and caring environment where children can explore the world around them and develop a sense of self and trust in the world through natural experiences in an environment prepared just for them.

### *Primary Classrooms Cedar, Salal, and Spruce* (\$50,000 each)

The Cedar, Salal, and Spruce classrooms house our primary program and are 1,000 sq ft each. Children of mixed-ages (3-6 year olds) learn and grow together- counting, scrubbing tables, feeding the fish, writing stories, creating art, reading, singing songs- in a natural environment. Teachers carefully prepare each classroom with Montessori materials and foster a lifelong love of learning through the freedom of choice and independent works. The classrooms lend themselves to an environment where cooperation and collaboration flourish as the children work together.

### *Elementary Classrooms Maple and Madrona* (\$50,000 each)

The Maple and Madrona classrooms house our elementary program. Mixed-age classrooms, 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> grade in the lower elementary classroom and 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade in the upper elementary classroom, help students learn through collaboration while allowing for student choice and self-guided inquiry and research. The carefully planned environments help each child develop academically and socially at his/her own pace. The academic curriculum centers on the great lessons, history, geography, science, human relations, language, mathematics, geometry, research skills, art, music, and drama. These classrooms are where the children not only learn the curriculum but discover their own potential and the possibility of them becoming an active and important agent of change.

### *Community Kitchen* (\$50,000)

The Community Kitchen will be held in the Community Building where it will be used for culinary education, school events, and community non-profits. The kitchen will be a full-service kitchen with full-sized refrigerator, stove, oven, sink, and microwave. Our culinary education programs will use the space as well as any food-based projects or cultural learning through food. The space will offer a food preparation and serving space for all school gatherings, informational nights, and special events. The kitchen will provide a more versatile space for community groups and non-profits to use our Community Building during non-school hours.

### *Elementary Playground* (\$35,000)

The elementary playground will include naturalistic play structures like natural balance beams, climbing boulders, tree climbing area, and fort building area. The playground will also have a play structure with swings, cargo nets, and slides. A wood chip track and a playfield for use at recess and during Fitness. Evergreen hedges will partition the elementary playground from the primary playground.

### *Children's House Playground* (\$35,000)

The Children's House Playground will have naturalistic age-appropriate equipment and play structures including the boat, cargo climbing nets, circle cycle, and swings. The students will have plenty of space to run and play on a wood chip track and a playfield. The Children's House Playground will be partitioned from the elementary playground by evergreen hedges.

### *Community Green: Sponsored by Immix Law Group (FUNDED)*

The Community Green is a place of collaboration and coming together. It is a gathering place for the entire school community. The Community Green will hold many school gatherings and celebrations including: The All School Fall Picnic, Kinder Graduation. The Elementary Moving-up Ceremony, and the Closing Circles among others.

*Parent Lounge*(\$15,000)

The parent lounge is where many life-long friendships are formed while parents connect and support one another through the experience of raising children together. The lounge will hold a parent resource library. This is a wonderful naming opportunity for a parent or group of parents who have found solace and friendship around the table in the Parent Lounge.

*Office Reception Area* (\$15,000)

The Community Building will house the office reception area and will serve as the initial greeting area for our school community and visitors.

*Staff Room & Faculty Lounge* (\$10,000)

The Staff Room and Faculty Lounge will give our staff the much-needed space to collaborate, plan lessons, and create learning opportunities for our students. This room will hold all the instructional supplies, works not in use, and learning materials. It will be a place for teacher collaboration and community building.

*Children's Herb Garden* (\$10,000)

The herb garden will hold a sundry of perennial herbs such as oregano, parsley, lavender, chives, thyme, and rosemary. It will create a space of sensory learning for our youngest students and an area of culinary learning for our older students.

*Nature Exploration Trails* (\$10,000)

Surrounding our campus, most notable from the elementary playground, there will be beautiful nature trails where students can experience natural exploration and scientific inquiry. The trails will be used for all levels science and natural world exploration both during direct instruction time and child-choice leisure time.

*Peace Pole* (\$10,000)

The Peace Pole reflects our commitment to nurture respect and love for our world's many cultures. The Peace Pole unites our community as it acts as a focal point for celebrations, a quiet place to gather for reflection, and a symbol of our desire to educate "Citizens of the World."

*Apple Orchard Trees*- 4 available (\$5,000 each (FUNDED 2)

The four apple trees will surround the Community Green and provide culinary education opportunities. As the trees produce apples in the fall, our students will revel in the time-honored tradition of picking the apples and pressing them into cider and creating other delicious healthy dishes.

*Benches* –5 available (\$5,000 each)

Throughout our landscaping and grounds, there will be benches available for use by our students and our school community. One bench will be in our Dorothy King flower garden- a wonderful spot for students to watch pollinators or enjoy scents of year-round blooming foliage. Two others will be near the Immix Community Green and two others will be on the playgrounds.
